The Homily Fr. Jon Roberts

Nicene Creed -All stand, if able

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. *In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever.


