#### THE LESSONS

**The First Lesson** (Isaiah 61:10-62:3)

Reader: A reading from the Book of Isaiah.

I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord GOD will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations. For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch. The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory;

and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the LORD will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

**The Psalm** 147:13-21 Laudate Dominum Said antiphonally by the people in unison

Reader: Worship the LORD, O Jerusalem; \* praise your God, O Zion;

*People:* For he has strengthened the bars of your gates; \*

he has blessed your children within you.

he satisfies you with the finest wheat.

*People:* He sends out his command to the earth, \*

and his word runs very swiftly.

Reader: He gives snow like wool; \* he scatters hoarfrost like ashes.

*Reader:* He sends forth his word and melts them; \* he blows with his wind, and the waters flow.

*People:* He declares his word to Jacob, \* his statutes and his judgments to Israel.

Reader: He has not done so to any other nation; \* to them he has not revealed his judgments. Hallelujah!

**The Second Lesson** (Galatians 3:23-25; 4:4-7)

Reader: A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Galatians.

Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian. But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

**The Gospel** (John 1:1-18) *Please stand where you are, if able.* 

Celebrant: The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. John ₹

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

(♣ Appropriate times to make the sign of the cross)

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said. 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

Celebrant: The Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

The Sermon The Rev. Jon Roberts

Nicene Creed - All stand, where you are, if able, and say in unison

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the

Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead  $\maltese$ , and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. AMEN.

It will take you to the giving page for Calvary, where you can bring your pledge up-to-date or perhaps give something extra to offset our losses due to the pandemic.

The Church is Open Mondays -Wednesday, 9am-1pm this week and next due to Christmas and New Year's Eve. The Red Doors remain open to allow private prayers by members and visitors alike, who wish to feel close to Jesus in peace and quiet. Every effort is being made to keep the sanctuary disinfected as we want those who desire the need for solitude to have a safe place they can come and pray. Safe practices signs are displayed.

Consider an hour a week to come and sit in our sanctuary to pray for our church, our Rector and Staff, our Vestry and volunteers, and all of those on our prayer list. Consider what a profound impact that would have. You may find this to be an excellent Advent, spiritual enrichment.

## Stewardship Update

The impact of Covid on all small businesses has been significant and alarming with many of such closing their doors and unable to meet their financial responsibilities. Although we do not consider ourselves a business, nor small, our ministry of proclaiming the Good News of Jesus is a mighty responsibility we take to heart. The role of the Church is vital to overcome such challenges in our world where people feel the stress and burdens of life. Therefore, our church depends on you, God's faithful witnesses to help us continue this ministry. We are the beacon of hope and the proclaimers of peace in the world through the mighty acts of God so please pray about how you may support the church financially.

An appeal is made every year to those who actively worship, whether they reside here year-round or seasonal; whether they attend in-person or virtual, to give financially. We are now in the first Sunday after Christmas and have met 83% of our pledged commitment goals with 52 returned cards, and a combined total of \$135,433. Our goal is 70 families, pledging an average of \$2,500 each. Some may give less and some may give more, and there are still 18 families in our church who can make a difference and help us reach our goal. We will continue to live by faith and trust that God will provide and be generous this year to Calvary through the submission of your pledged commitment. Consider making an increase from last year, or becoming a first time pledged giver to the Church.
