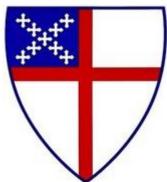
Section 1. Annual Meeting.

A Congregation shall hold an annual meeting every year. Unless otherwise specified in the Congregation's bylaws, the annual meeting of the Congregation shall be within one hundred twenty (120) days before or on the twenty-eighth (28th) day of February.

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Calvary Episcopal Church Annual Parish Meeting Minutes January 25th, 2015

Call to Order: The 2015 Annual Meeting was called to order by Fr. Jon Roberts at 10:35 AM. Judy Marx, the clerk of the vestry reported that there was a quorum present. Fr. Roberts began the meeting with the Calvary Parish prayer. Copies of the Annual Report were distributed to those present.

Election of Members to the Vestry: Fr. Roberts reported that there were four candidates for four positions on the vestry so no vote was needed. Those candidates are Jo Simpson, Jim Yanacheck, Chuck Pond and Derek Good. Jim English made a motion to have the clerk cast a unanimous ballot for these candidates. Marilyn Clark seconded the motion and a unanimous ballot was cast. Fr. Roberts thanked Helen Jedrey, Nancy Pappas, and Debbie Thayer, retiring vestry members, for their hard work and faithful service to Calvary. Fr Roberts stated that each vestry member is in charge of a commission. These commissions are: Leadership, Property and Grounds, Christian Education, Connections (Communications), Fellowship, Missions, Outreach, Pastoral Care Stewardship and Worship. He stated that we are seeing growth in each commission.

Approval of 2014 Annual Meeting Minutes: Barbara Annen made a motion to accept the minutes of the 2014 Annual Meeting as presented. Mike Alford seconded and the motion carried.

Presentation of the 2015 Church Budget: Fr. Roberts stated that the Finance Committee has a monumental task to draft a budget when the amount being given is unknown. John Harper, Calvary's Treasurer presented the budget for 2015. Connie Curran made a motion to accept the 2015 Budget as presented. Bob Lima seconded and the motion carried. Fr. Roberts thanked John Harper for stepping in to serve as Treasurer.

Parochial Cross Presentation: Three members of Calvary were presented with the Parochial Cross in recognition of their service to Calvary. Those receiving crosses were Martha Kelley, Betsey McKenna and Lynne Roberts.

Report on Youth Activities: Fr. Roberts stated that with Dianne Oeste's guidance, youth participation has had a great increase in learning and in interest. New programs have been started. 25% of our Sunday attendance are our youth. The children love to go to Children's Chapel. We need more teachers and youth leaders.

Church Directory Information: It was announced that information slips had been placed on each table to update our parish directory information. Each member was asked to fill out one of these slips and turn it in so that the Calvary records can be updated.

Winterfest: Bill Athanson, Chairman of Winterfest reminded us that Winterfest this year is February 14, Valentine's Day and there would be no better way to spend the day. There will be something for every age – patriotic parades, silent auction, a street party with live entertainment, crafts, a bake sale, and several varieties of food and drink. We all need to support Winterfest. This is our main money making event of the year.

Calvary Staff: Fr. Roberts thanked the staff. He thanked our Music Director, Matthew Burke who has given so much to the beauty of our music. He thanked Laurie Lawther, our new parish secretary who has brought her wonderful talents to serve Calvary. He also thanked all of the volunteers who so faithfully give of their time to assist the staff. Finally he thanked Deacon Melissa whom he considers a spiritual as well as a wonderful personal friend. Her smile warms everyone at Calvary.

Fr. Roberts asked all present who joined Calvary in 2014 to stand.

He also thanked Connie Curran for her leadership in the Food Pantry.

Jack and Tyna Westman were welcomed back for a visit to Calvary.

Jerry Brewer reminded the attendees that there is a catered luncheon at St. Dunstan's at 12 Noon on Saturday, January 31st to look at the possibility of having a joint ECW group.

Dear Calvary Family,

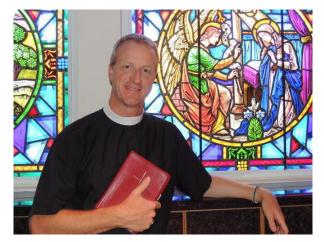
On this day, the text of scripture that resonates comes from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians (13:1-13) where he exhorted this faithful, young church by saying these famous words: "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." This past year has been just that for our faithful, young Calvary. This has been a "loving" year.

I presented a new model of leadership for the Vestry to follow when arriving in 2013. Called the "Ten Great Commissions," this has clearly proven to be a good way in helping us meet our goals. They characterize our mission statement, "To know Christ and to make Him known." Within these commissions leaders have been called and equipped for the challenge, to be patient and kind; not envious or boastful, arrogant or rude. For the entire year I have not once observed any leader or volunteer within their commissions, who would insist on their own way, being arrogant or rejoicing in wrongdoing. There is warmth and vitality in the way we come to worship and fellowship. Looking back over all the monthly newsletters, seeing the abundance of photos, you can just see how much we have experienced. Several stand out. A beautiful and productive Winterfest, colorful and well-attended Easter & Christmas services, inaugural summer mission trips, sung Evensong, quiet and faithful morning prayer, shoeboxes wrapped for migrant children, holiday meals provided for needy families, Wednesday night dinners, theme night dinners (Country-Western, Italian, Octoberfest, etc.), the Inspirational Tea & Fashion Show, a bumper crop Confirmation Class, diocesan convention, and one of my personal favorites, "The Christmas Mission Across America" musical. Throughout these many activities, and many more not mentioned, you can tell our time together has been a place where love never ended.

It all came home to me when attending the CREDO clergy conference, a spiritual retreat, in Lake Logan, NC in October that God has called me to be patient, kind and true to my calling; as His faithful "child", Lynne's loving husband, Emma & Watson's patient father, and the true and loving "Father" of all who come to Calvary. If I continue to be true to this call, God will even expand my ability to love further into our community. It is sometimes difficult to imagine that love never ends.

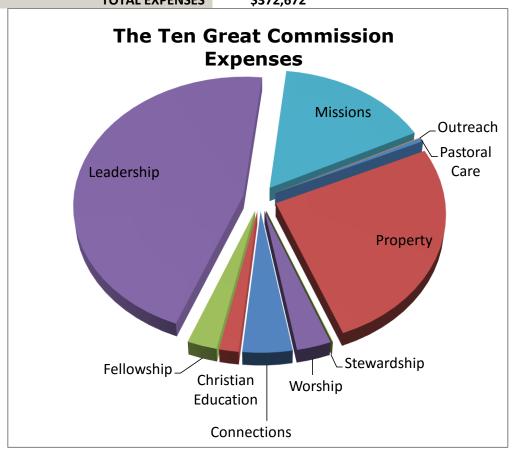

The "Ten Great Commissions"

Jesus told his followers, moments before His glorious ascension into Heaven, to, "Go forth and make disciples." The Vestry supports the "Ten Great Commissions" model proposed by Fr. Jon that has become a most useful way for us to accomplish our activities, goals and certainly our mission, "To know Christ and make Him known." We are engaged in making disciples. Each Commission has a Vestry Chair appointed at the retreat following the Annual Parish Meeting. With a twelve-member Vestry we utilize each member and call them to serve as these appointed leaders based on their spiritual gifts. The Rector is a member ex officio of all meetings to whom each Commission provides a written annual report in order for reflection, evaluate and growth. Each Commission is coordinated and cooperates with the other commissions on a continuing basis.

In order to give an overview along with goals and accomplishments of this past year at Calvary, the Ten Great Commissions are listed here:

The **Connections** Commission acts as the agent of the church in relationship with the media and in publishing news about the church both internally and externally.

The **Christian Education** Commission is responsible for the education of all members of our congregation with knowledge of our Anglican tradition and reference to Biblical Scripture when reasoning with God's truth in the world.

The **Fellowship** Commission coordinates and hosts the various fellowship functions including events, dinners and receptions to celebrate our common life together.

The **Leadership** Commission is responsible for the "making of disciples" and giving the tools to those who are called within the Church to evaluate and administrate those things that are both temporal and spiritual.

The **Missions** Committee plans and administers programs and projects of assistance to the community and worldwide.

The **Outreach** Commission ensures that the church engages in mission in the community as a faithful evangelist by sharing Good News and reaching out to our visitors and the un-churched in our area.

The **Pastoral Care** Commission identifies ways in which to demonstrate compassion through prayer and visiting those who are sick, in need or in trouble.

The **Property** Commission identifies needed repairs and /or maintenance of the facility and grounds and seeks remedial solutions.

The **Stewardship** Commission is responsible for the funding of the church through gifts and pledges and for the sharing of time and talents for the mission and ministry of the church.

The **Worship** Commission provides worship opportunities for all members of our congregation and the community at large.

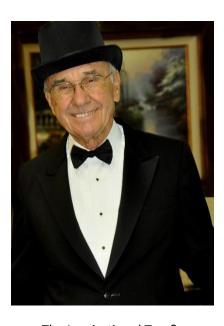

Remember Christians are always involved in OUTREACH.

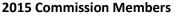
Goals:

Stewardship Commission

Overview:

I would like to extend my personal thanks to the various Ministries and the Finance Committee for all the hard work they did to finally submit our church budget to the Vestry for approval. Also, many thanks to the 8am and 10am Sunday counters. Their personal contribution is greatly appreciated. The FY 2016 Budget was developed by the Finance Committee with much enthusiasm, debate, and final agreement. A special thank you to Chairperson Maria Gonzales, Mike Alford, Greg Donham, Keith Oeste, and Cherie Smith. They carried the burden of watching over our finances, assuring that our bills were paid on a timely and accurate basis. – Phil Beauchamp (Newly appointed Treasurer, 2016)

2015 Summary as of December 31:

We entered FY2015 with available cash of \$28,736 in our Regions checking account and with Budgeted Income at \$328,200. Actual Income was \$332,562, favorable of \$4,362. Expenses were budgeted at \$369,250, with actual expense of \$338,984, favorable of \$30,265. During the summer, with monthly Income expected at our seasonal low, we avoided a transfer of \$41,051 from the allowable interest of our unrestricted Investment and Endowment Accounts to the operating account. As of 12/31/15, the actual operating loss for the year improved to only \$6,422 Managing our Expenses throughout the year largely contributed to this favorable result.

<u>Goals:</u> The 2016 Budgeted Income is projected at \$349,070, an increase of \$20,870 or 6.3%. The Budgeted Expense is projected at \$372,672, an increase of \$3,421. The shortfall in Net Operating Income in the budget will be balanced by a transfer of \$23,602

from Investment Revenue. Strong stewardship with both Income and Expense will be required to meet our budget challenge for 2016.

2016 Budget Summary: While the overall financial condition of Calvary has improved during this past year, and continued improvement is planned with the 2016 Operating Budget, Calvary continues to rely on its Investment Revenue to meet Operating Budget shortfalls. The amount planned to transfer from Investment Revenue in 2016 is \$23,602 which is less than prior year which is a favorable direction. The Endowment Fund at year end 2015 totaled \$562,669, and our other Unrestricted Investment Fund was at \$148,561. The Congregation and Vestry Leadership, along with the Finance Committee, will be challenged with Evangelistic and Capital needs in the near future. However, the immediate financial condition of Calvary is improving.

Altar Guild

In general, the duty of the Altar Guild is to prepare all things necessary for the conduct and celebration of public worship at Calvary. It is our responsibility to help those who enter through the doors of Calvary to "worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness." This takes devotion and the acknowledgment that this ministry of service in the sanctuary is a sacred trust. This guiet, behind-the-scenes "holy house work" we hope is a true gift to the entire congregation.
