

THE LESSONS

The First Lesson (Jonah 3:1-5, 10)

Reader: A reading from the Book of Jonah.

The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and

everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

The Psalm 62:6-14 *Nonne Deo?*

Said antiphonally by the people

Reader: For God alone my soul in silence waits; * truly, my hope is in him.

People: He alone is my rock and my salvation, * my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.

Reader: In God is my safety and my honor; * God is my strong rock and my refuge.

People: Put your trust in him always, O people, * pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge.

Reader: Those of high degree are but a fleeting breath, * even those of low estate cannot be trusted.

People: On the scales they are lighter than a breath, * all of them together.

Reader: Put no trust in extortion;

in robbery take no empty pride; *

though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.

People: God has spoken once, twice have I heard it, * that power belongs to God.

Reader: Steadfast love is yours, O Lord, *

for you repay everyone according to his deeds.

The Second Lesson (1 Corinthians 7:29-31)

Reader: A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

I mean, brothers and sisters, the appointed time has grown short; from now on, let even those who have wives be as though they had none, and those who mourn as though they were not mourning, and those who rejoice as though they were not rejoicing, and those who buy as though they had no possessions, and those who deal with the world as though they had no dealings with it. For the present form of this world is passing away.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel (Mark 1:14-20) Please stand where you are, if able.

Celebrant: The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark ₹

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

(Appropriate times to make the sign of the cross)

After John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

Celebrant: The Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

The Sermon The Rev. Jon Roberts

Nicene Creed - All stand, where you are, if able, and say in unison

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead \maltese , and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Everyone is invited to come forward to receive either the Blessed Sacrament or a Blessing from the Priest. Due to the Bishop's decree, the chalice with the blood of Christ is not to be administered at all, in any manner. Here are the following signs to make when coming forth:

Blessing only: Cross arms over chest Bread only: Hands, stacked and open

All Baptized Christians may receive Holy Communion and others are encouraged to receive a Blessing from the priest, especially young children who have not yet made their first Communion. After reception, quietly return to your pew and pray. You are receiving spiritual food on this day.



Stewardship Update

The impact of Covid on all small businesses has been significant and alarming with many of such closing their doors and unable to meet their financial responsibilities. Although we do not consider ourselves a business, nor small, our ministry of proclaiming the Good News of Jesus is a mighty responsibility we take to heart. The role of the Church is vital to overcome such challenges in our world where people feel the stress and burdens of life. Therefore, our church depends on you, God's faithful witnesses to help us continue this ministry. We are the beacon of hope and the proclaimers of peace in the world through the mighty acts of God so please pray about how you may support the church financially.

Our Stewardship campaign technically ended with the year, but we have not met our goals and are still accepting pledges. Currently we have meet 81% of our pledged commitment goals with 57 commitment entered into Realm and a combined total of \$138,417.00. We appreciate all that you do to support us in time, talent and treasure. If you have not yet submitted your pledged commitment yet, it is not too late.
